

Project Based Learning Model in The Post Pandemi Period at Pancasakti Tegal University

Since the Covid-19 pandemic was declared over, and learning activities have been allowed to be carried out face-to-face, of course this will make a lot of changes. Changes in the atmosphere and conditions of learning activities are very interesting to study. This certainly can be used as material for evaluating the models, methods and learning media used. The learning model that is suitable after studying online for a long time so that students don't get bored is the project-based learning model. The project based learning learning model is a learner-centered learning model. Where students are trained so that they can become independent individuals, able to solve problems by producing a project. The project-based learning learning model is theoretically very suitable when applied to the post-Covid-19 pandemic, but further research is still needed to test its effectiveness.

In the world of education, these two years have experienced very significant changes, especially in Indonesia where learning activities have always been carried out face-to-face, not even though learning activities have been carried out online. Not all educators are proficient in the IT field. This is certainly homework for all educational institutions, especially in tertiary institutions. On September 16 2022, Pancasakti University of Tegal issued Chancellor's Circular Number 1340/K/D/UPS/VIII/2022 concerning Organizing Odd Semester Learning for the 2022/2023 Academic Year, the contents of which stated that it was permissible for learning activities to be carried out face-to-face but must remain implementing health protocols.

2. Method

The project-based learning learning model has one goal, one of which is that students are given the opportunity to explore material in various ways and to be able to conduct experiments collaboratively.

[7] state that the project based learning model is a learning model that uses problems to integrate new knowledge based on real experience. Meanwhile, [8] says that the project-based learning model is a learning model that uses projects as learning media to achieve attitude, skill and knowledge competencies.

From some of the definitions above, the authors conclude that the project-based learning model is a learner-centered learning model, motivated by a problem which students are then given the opportunity to be able to investigate these problems so they can gain real experience so they can learn to solve problems by produce a project.

b. Project Based Learning Learning Model Syntax

Each learning model has syntax. This is of course so that learning activities can achieve the expected goals. The steps that must be taken in implementing the project based learning learning model are as follows.

- a) Prepare questions related to the material being studied.
- b) Develop a project plan.
- c) Make Schedulle.
- d) Monitor the implementation of project-based learning.

- e) Test and provide value to the project created.
- f) Evaluation of project-based learning.
- c. The advantages of applying the Project Based Learning Learning Model
 - a) Students will learn to solve a problem with the knowledge they have.
 - b) Students can integrate their knowledge and skills simultaneously and can apply them in the relevant context.
 - c) Students will be more able to think critically, be able to foster initiative while working which can develop interpersonal relationships in groups..
 - d) In project based learning learning is very closely related to situations in real life so that the learning experience of students is more meaningful.
 - e) Students are given the opportunity to choose what to learn and how to learn it.
 - f) Making cooperative learning.

3. Conclusion
